

**CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHTS AFTER GLOBALISATION: AN OVERVIEW**

**Abstract**

Globalisation of contemporary times has brought in neo-liberal policies in the realm of State. Neo-liberalism which is the economic policy after second world war is against planning, policies promoting social justice like social security, reservations etc. In a country like India where social democracy forms the basic feature of Constitution neo-liberal policies are hard to find a place. But due to the impelling economic exigencies during the post-independence era has made India dependent on institutions like World Bank, World Trade Organization, and International Monetary Organization etc. This dependency leads to surrendering of economic and political sovereignty to these non-state actors. Consequently the welfare activities of the State have come to a halt. The impact of this is reflected in the economic policy of liberalization and privatization since 1991. The reluctance of the government to undertake welfare activities has affected the poor and marginalized sections of the society. The following is an analysis of the same.
